Alaska Legal Services Corporation is recruiting for a full-time (35 hours per week) Staff Attorney in the Utqiagvik office to provide civil legal assistance with special emphasis on legal issues faced by real property owners including probate assistance, and estate planning, as well as other Native law issues. Other duties include working with community groups, planning and conducting community legal education, and traveling as needed to small communities and rural villages in the North Slope Borough.

Required: Applicants must be admitted to practice law in Alaska or admitted to practice in another state and be eligible for an Alaska Bar Rule 43 waiver.
