### TRAINING OVERVIEW

After completing the SNAP and Ethics trainings, participants will be able to:

- Help individuals with delayed or denied SNAP applications.
- Request fair hearings.
- Negotiate with State representatives.
- Represent clients during SNAP fair hearings, when appropriate.
- Share legal information about SNAP rights and options.

- Approximately 3-6 hours per course
